

SERVICE CODES

105	Attendant Care	Attendant Care service provides hands on care and support to meet the needs of a physically handicapped consumer from any of the three CDC+ populations. Services may include skilled nursing care that is administered by a licensed healthcare professional. At the consumer or representative's discretion, skilled care may be provided by a designated individual who is trained by a licensed healthcare provider to perform the specific services needed by the consumer as outlined on page 36 of the <u>CDC+ Guidelines</u> . Services may also include personal care services such as, but not limited to, personal hygiene and nutrition or housekeeping activities such as, but not limited to, bed changing when essential to the recipient's health and welfare.
110	Chore Services	These services may include heavy household chores such as moving furniture and washing the floors. The emphasis is on maintaining a sanitary environment and providing safe access to the property.
111	Companion Services	These services include supervising and assisting with various tasks that are incidental to the care of the recipient; such as meal preparation, laundry, shopping and light housekeeping. These services can be provided in or out of the home. Companions engage in socialization, and can assist in walking, standing, and sitting.
115	Escort	Escorts are trained individuals who accompany and assist recipients to and from service providers. However, they are not permitted to use their personal, or rented vehicles. Escorts often provide language translations and interpretations for their customers.
121	Homemaker	Homemakers perform general household activities. These activities may include meal preparation, housekeeping, laundry, and minor home repair. The services must be provided in the recipient's home.
132	Personal Care Assistance	Under the instruction and supervision of the consumer or representative, Personal Care Assistance is provided to the consumer such as, but not limited to, assistance with eating, bathing, dressing, personal hygiene and nutrition. This may include tasks such as meal preparation and assistance to and from the bathroom. In addition, this service may also include housekeeping chores such as bed making, dusting and vacuuming when they are essential to the recipient's health and welfare. These services may be provided in or out of the home.
146	Respite	Respite services are provided on a short-term basis to individuals unable to care for themselves. These care givers are substitutes for the recipient's primary care giver. Services must be provided inside the home.

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209	<p style="text-align: center;">Evaluation Counseling Training</p> <p>(Examples: Behavioral programming, counseling, life skills training, personal adjustment counseling, rehab engineering evaluation.)</p>	<p><u>Evaluation services</u> provided to assess the consumer's behavior and a plan to include training for the consumer's caregivers developed. Evaluation to help consumers with problems encountered because of a traumatic injury.</p> <p><u>Counseling services</u> address the symptoms arising from the stresses of the aging process and the functional limitations of the recipient. Counseling services assist the recipient with the development of appropriate personal support networks, social skills, and interpersonal functioning. Counseling therapy services may also be provided to a consumer because of a traumatic injury.</p> <p><u>Training</u> and support may be provided to consumers to help with activities of daily living (ADLs) after an injury including planning and preparation of nutritionally appropriate meals and promoting good health.</p>
247	<p style="text-align: center;">Skilled Nurse LPN or RN</p>	<p>Nursing care in the client's place of residence. Services must be provided by a licensed, registered professional nurse.</p>
238	<p style="text-align: center;">Rehabilitation Therapy</p>	<p>Therapy must be provided by licensed, Medicaid-participating therapist and by supervised therapy assistants.</p> <p><u>Occupational Therapy</u>: Assists the recipient with the development of self-help skills.</p> <p><u>Activities of Daily Living (ADLs)</u>: Provides assessment and hands on guidance to recipients and caregivers about exercises that increase physical strength, dexterity, and endurance. These procedures are intended to be short term and increase the consumer's ability to perform the activities of daily living.</p> <p><u>Physical Therapy</u>: Physician prescribed therapy intended to improve or restore neuromuscular or sensory motor function and relieve pain.</p> <p><u>Speech Therapy</u>: This physician prescribed service provides evaluation and treatment of conditions that interfere with respiratory functions. Services may include activities such as ventilator support, therapeutic and diagnostic uses of medical gases, and management of life support systems. This physician prescribed service includes the evaluation and treatment of problems related to oral motor dysfunction.</p>
301	<p style="text-align: center;">Adult day health care</p>	<p>Four or more hours a day of service on a regular basis that provides social and health activities to older and frail adults in a setting outside the home.</p>
303	<p style="text-align: center;">Adult Dental services</p>	<p>Regular dental care, maintenance and health.</p>

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320	Home delivered meals	This service provides prepared, nutritious meals for the consumer and delivered to the consumer's home. The meals may be obtained from a provider agency, restaurant or individual. It is intended for those who have difficulty shopping for groceries or preparing meals.
334	Personal Emergency Response Services	The installation of an electronic device or help button, that enables individuals at high risk of institutionalization to secure help in an emergency. This service is typically for consumers who live alone, or are alone for part of the day and require supervision. The device links the consumer to a 24 hour response center.
335	Pest control – Monthly	Helps rid the consumer's environment of insects, rodents and other household pests which are potential carriers of disease.
360	Transportation	Travel to or from community services and resources, health and medical care, shopping and social activities.
463	Consumable medical supplies	Consumable supplies to maintain consumers' personal hygiene.

CASH CODES

510	Chore Services	These services may include heavy household chores such as maintaining a sanitary environment and providing safe access to the property.
533	Personal Emergency Response System	The installation of an electronic device or help button, that enables individuals at high risk of institutionalization to secure help in an emergency. This service is typically for consumers who live alone, or are alone for part of the day and require supervision. The device links the consumer to a 24 hour response center.
535	Pest Control	Helps rid the environment of insects, and other potential carriers of disease.
562	Transportation	Travel to or from community services and resources, health and medical care, shopping, social activities.
563	Consumable medical supp.	Consumable supplies to maintain consumers' health and hygiene.
565	Over-the-counter medications	Medications that are not prescribed by a doctor.
566	Nutritional supplements	May be prescribed or over-the-counter.
567	Vitamins	May be prescribed or over-the-counter
569	Lawn care	Maintenance of a consumer's lawn provided to return the recipient's home and property to a clean, sanitary and safe environment.
570	Home delivered meals	This service provides prepared, nutritious meals to be delivered to the recipient's home. The meals may be obtained from a provider agency, restaurant or individual. It is intended for those who have difficulty shopping for groceries or preparing meals.
571	Maintain Hygiene	Products and supplies to maintain consumer's health and hygiene. (Examples: toothbrush, toothpaste, hair brush, deodorant)
572	Postage	Mailing CDC+ documents to the CDC+ consultant or DOEA, the fiscal/employer agent.
575	Professional Medical	Health care services from licensed practitioners that are not covered by Medicare, Medicaid or private health insurance.
580	Workers Compensation Insurance premiums	Assistance with Workers Compensation Insurance premiums that are required for Consumers with 4 or more employees.

SAVINGS CODES

603	Adult Dental Care	Dental treatment and procedures that are not covered by Medicare, Medicaid or private insurance.
646	Respite Care	Savings for respite care after all primary healthcare needs are met.
660	Transportation	Travel to or from community services and resources, health and medical care, shopping and social activities.
677	General Equipment	Fan, heater, air conditioner, computer, clothes washer or other necessary appliances for the consumer's health and well-being.
678	Medical Equipment	Walkers, wheelchairs, hospital beds, bedside commodes, motion-monitoring devices, etc.
679	Accessibility adaptation Home or Vehicle	Items that improve accessibility and freedom within the consumer's home or vehicle. (Examples: ramps, lifts or electric doors, etc.)
681	Assistive/Adaptive equipment/devices	Equipment, devices or assistive technology that assist the consumer (Examples: lighted doorbell, extended-handle gripper, telephone amplifier, adaptive eating utensils.)
682	Repairs to medical equipment	Wheelchairs, hospital beds, etc.
683	General equipment repairs	Repairs to furnace, air conditioning, appliances.
684	Batteries	Wheelchair or household batteries for the consumer's health and well-being.
686	Worker training	This training provides training to the family or the consumers. The sessions may include topics such as instructions about treatment regimens, which are necessary to the care of the consumer. The training can be provided on an individual basis or in a group setting.
689	Advertisements	Assistance in finding employees for hire by the household employer.
690	One-Time Expenditure	Expenditures that are so significant that it would not be reasonable to save for them on a monthly basis. One-time monies for purchases that meet the criteria of maintaining the consumer's health, safety and welfare.
699	Emergency Back-up Worker salary	Funds that the consumer saves to supplement budgeted funds for services needed in an emergency for back-up employees through an agency.
